KEY CONCLUSIONS FROM THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE "INNOVATIVE ECONOMY IN TIMES OF GLOBAL CHALLENGES"

◆ **1. Innovation is the central driver of modern economic growth.**

◆ **2. Sustainability and innovation must go hand in hand.**

The implementation of innovations must align with ecological, economic, and social sustainability principles. Particular emphasis was placed on green technologies, the circular economy, and climate resilience.

◆ **3. A redefinition of economic models is needed in response to new global challenges.**

Recent global crises have exposed the limitations of traditional economic models. There is a growing need for flexible, inclusive, and sustainable frameworks capable of addressing the complexity of the modern world.

◆ **4. The innovation economy must be socially responsible.**

The development of innovative solutions should address social equity, inclusion, and the needs of vulnerable groups, emphasizing the importance of the social economy and accessible technology.

◆ **5. Global cooperation is essential for sustainable progress.**

The conference reaffirmed that open dialogue, international networking, and knowledge-sharing are vital for shaping economic policies that transcend national boundaries and foster collective responses to global challenges.
